### WARM UP YOUR WALLET THIS WINTER AND SAVE

One of the many benefits of being a member of Freeborn Mower Electric Cooperative is that we offer several different opportunities for our members to save money through our rebate and financing programs.

Maybe your heating, ventilation, or air conditioning(HVAC) equipment is outdated and not providing you the desired energy efficiency during the peak of winter or hot summer months? Let's face it. We know that replacing this type of equipment can come with a hefty price tag and we have some good news for members that wish to enhance their home by making it more energy efficient.

Members of our cooperative have the opportunity to apply for Beneficial Electrification Financing which is a low-interest loan (\$1,000-\$7,500) that can be borrowed over two to five years. This opportunity is available to help our members, and reduce the financial burden of paying for upgrades all at once. The monthly loan payment is simply added into your regular monthly electric utility bill. This loan can be used for the purpose of not only installing energy efficient HVAC equipment, but also electric water heating equipment, insulation, windows, doors, permanent standby generators, whole house battery back-up, electric vehicle charging equipment and Energy Star Appliances. The process is simple and by calling our office at (507) 373-6421, one of our Energy Solution Specialists would be happy to provide more information.

Another way for our members to get cash back into their pockets is through a wide variety of rebates offered on Energy Star appliances, water heaters, LED lighting, heating, ventilation or air conditioning, and much more. #2162303 New equipment rebate(s) must be submitted no later than 3 months after the purchase date and must be installed on the cooperative's lines.

Rebates for 2024 must be submitted no later than December 31, 2024. FMEC members are encouraged to apply as soon as possible because funds are limited. Visit our website at www.fmec.coop for more details.

As we look to the future, we do so with a profound sense of gratitude and optimism, continuing to be guided by the seven cooperative principles that make us who we are.


Our commitment to the communities we serve, and our members will remain unwavering.

#### NOTICE OF INTERCONNECTION DISTRIBUTED ENERGY: CO-GENERATORS AND SMALL POWER PRODUCERS

In accordance with the adopted Cooperative Rules implementing 216.B.164, Freeborn Mower Electric Cooperative is obligated to interconnect with and purchase electricity from cogenerators and small power producers that satisfy the conditions and become a Qualifying Facility. A Qualifying Facility is a cogeneration and small power production facility that satisfies the conditions in the 18 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 292.101 (b).

Freeborn Mower Electric Cooperative has posted the current interconnection documents on the cooperative's website (www.fmec.coop). Click on Energy Services and then Renewables. Proceed by using the NOVA Power Portal. A complete Distributed Energy Document Library is available online.

All interconnections require an application and approval to become a Qualifying Facility. Any disputes over interconnection, sales, and purchases are subject to resolution by the cooperative.

### NOTICE OF RIGHTS FOR HOUSEHOLDS OF MILITARY SERVICE PERSONNEL



# **SEEKING APPLICANTS** FOR THREE DIRECTOR SEATS



Freeborn Mower Electric Cooperative is governed by a nineperson board of directors. The directors are elected by their fellow FMEC members residing in the district. Elections are held in three districts each year, with each director elected to serve a three-year term.

Applications are now being accepted for the position of Director 6. is in any way employed by or substantially financially in the following districts:

**DISTRICT 2:** Represents the Lerdal, Hollandale, Geneva, Maple Island, Corning, Moscow, and Oakland areas. **DISTRICT 5:** Represents the areas east of Hayward, Gordonsville, Myrtle, London, Lyle, Rose Creek, and Johnsburg. **DISTRICT 8:** Represents the south part of the city of Albert Lea.

Applicants must meet all eligibility requirements as specified in the Cooperative's Bylaws. Among the qualifications and responsibilities outlined in the Bylaws, nominees must be:

- 1. a current member receiving electric service at their primary residence, and
- 2. the primary residence must be in the district in which the director is elected.

No person shall be eligible to become or remain a director of the Cooperative who:

- 1. is not a natural person and a member of the Cooperative, receiving service at the member's primary residence in the district from which the director is elected:
- 2. within five (5) years preceding a director candidate's nomination was or during service on the Board of Directors is finally adjudged to be guilty of a felony;
- 3. within three (3) years preceding a director candidate's nomination was an employee of the Cooperative;

- 4. is an employee of the Cooperative or a grandparent, parent, spouse, co-habitant, child, or grandchild of an employee of the Cooperative:
- 5. is a person that is a grandparent, parent, spouse, cohabitant, child, or grandchild of an incumbent director whose district seat is not up for re-election at that time;
- interested in an enterprise competing with the Cooperative or any Cooperative-affiliated business;
- is or becomes the full-time employee or agent of, or who is 7. or becomes the full-time employer or principal of, another director:
- is engaged in conduct that is a violation of law or violation 8. of a Cooperative policy or policies, or whenever a director has materially failed to satisfy his/her duties as a director, including the duty to regularly attend meetings of the Board of Directors; or
- 9. is employed by, materially affiliated with, or has a financial interest in, any individual or entity possessing a material or substantial conflict of interest with the Cooperative or a Cooperative subsidiary.

If you are a member of Freeborn Mower Electric Cooperative residing in one of the districts holding an election and would like to run for the position of FMEC director, please contact our office for an information packet. If you are unsure of the district in which you reside, it is shown on your electric statement.

Applications are due in our office by 3:30 p.m. on Wednesday, December 11, 2024.

### MEMBER GOVERNANCE

Freeborn Mower Electric Cooperative is owned and controlled by the members using its services. This core principle sets us apart from other forms of utilities. Additionally, we operate on a not-for-profit basis through our Capital Credit retirement (return) of margins. Because we are so close to the members and their communities, we take pride in being both accountable and accessible.

Any member who meets the Bylaw Qualifications and has a desire to become a Director of Freeborn Mower Electric Cooperative may apply for an open board position. This includes minorities, women, and individuals with a disability. Nominations are now open for members of District 2, District 5, and District 8. If you are unsure of the District in which you reside, see your monthly billing statement or call our office.

### RESPONSIBILITIES **OF DIRECTORS**

While representing the members of their district, elected directors become a part of a nine-member board tasked with making decisions in the best interest of all members and the cooperative business. Directors work with the management team to provide direction and general oversight of the cooperative. Directors set policies, including retail rates.

To be effective, Directors must be able to read financial statements, forecasts, and strategic reports. Director oversight ensures the democratic functioning of the cooperative in accordance with the Cooperative's Bylaws and respects the confidentiality of information provided or discussed. #110700 Directors must attend monthly meetings at the cooperative headquarters, typically on the last Tuesday of each month. They may also be called to additional meetings and training sessions.

# **ELECTION** PROCESS

Completed applications are due by 3:30 p.m. on Wednesday, December 11, 2024. After applications have been returned, members in each of the three districts holding an election will be notified of those who have filed.

#### POST FILING DEADLINE — **NOMINATION BY PETITION**

After the filing application deadline has expired, persons may still be nominated by filing a petition form, also available from our office. To become a nominee by petition requires fifteen (15) members from the district in which the election is being held to sign in support of a particular nominee on the petition form.

The petition form must be submitted to the cooperative office by 3:30 p.m. on Friday, January 17, 2025.

#### WHEN THERE IS A SINGLE NOMINEE

Should only one nominee in a district come forward before the final deadline by petition, that applicant will be deemed elected as director.

#### WHEN THERE ARE MULTIPLE NOMINEES

Should more than one nominee come forth by the petition deadline, either by direct nomination or petition, a biography of each nominee and a mail ballot will be sent to all members in the district on Friday, January 31, 2025. Returned ballots will be due on Thursday, February 20, 2025.

Please return mailed ballots in the proper envelopes to the third-party ballot company and not to our cooperative. Also, allow for any possible mail delays.

#### **DIRECTORS BEGIN TERM**

The elected directors will be seated during the Annual Meeting on Tuesday, April 1, 2025.

- 1 lb. 85% ground beef
- 2/3 C. onions, chopped
- 1 Tbsp. yellow mustard
- 1 Tbsp. ketchup
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Tsp. salt
- 1/8 Tsp. (scant) pepper
- 1 10 ½ oz. chicken gumbo soup
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> C. water

#### **Directions:**

In skillet, brown ground beef, onion, salt, & pepper. Mix in the rest of the ingredients and simmer until done, stirring occasionally.
