POST FILING DEADLINE FOR NOMINATION BY PETITION

After the December filing deadline has expired, persons may still be nominated by filing a petition form that is available from the FMEC office. To become a nominee by petition requires fifteen (15) members from the district in which the election is being held to sign in support of a particular nominee on the petition form. The petition form must be submitted to the cooperative office by 3:30 p.m. on Friday, January 17, 2025.



WHEN THERE IS A SINGLE NOMINEE

Should there be only one nominee come forward in the district by the Nominee by Petition deadline, that applicant will be deemed elected as Director.

WHEN THERE ARE MULTIPLE NOMINEES

Should multiple names be filed in a particular district, a biography of each nominee will be sent to all members of the district on Friday, January 31, 2025. Returned ballots are due on Thursday, February 20, 2025. Ballots must be returned in the provided envelope to the third-party balloting company and not to our cooperative. Allow for possible mail delays.

DIRECTORS BEGIN TERM

The elected directors will be seated during the Annual Meeting on Tuesday, April 1, 2025.



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
WINTER DOESN'T SLOW US DOWN

Old Man Winter doesn't stop our Operations Department. Throughout the winter months, our crews are hard at work, though the workload shifts from underground work to overhead work. Typically, the underground work is reserved for the spring when temperatures allow for the ground to thaw.

In 2025, Co-op crews will be doing several large underground projects in the Glenville and Austin areas. 8 miles of aging 3 phase and 1 phase overhead lines will be buried west of Glenville and 1.5 miles of overhead line will be buried north of Austin. #1800003 1 mile of 3 phase overhead line will also be buried east of Sargeant. These projects are part of a larger 12 year plan to continually improve the distribution system to continue to provide safe, reliable power to our members.

The Co-op inspects the poles and other distribution infrastructure on a 10-year cycle. Each year rejected poles are identified as well as other maintenance items from these annual inspections. Co-op crews then repair/replace these items in the following year based off the results of these annual inspections. Much of this overhead work is completed in the winter months alongside maintenance to our fleet and tree trimming.

There are a lot of moving parts in FMEC's Operations Department and it takes a significant amount of strategic planning to maintain the level of service we provide our members. Not only are the crews working on large scale projects, but they are also monitoring our distribution system looking for areas that may need repair or replacement before an outage occurs.





There's no mistaking that Minnesota winters have the potential to wreak havoc on our power distribution system. It is important to have a plan in place in case power is interrupted this season due to a weather event. Here's some tips on how you can prepare for winter power outages:

- 1. **EMERGENCY KIT:** Assemble an emergency kit that includes flashlights, batteries, a battery-powered or hand-crank radio, first aid supplies, and any necessary medications.
- 2. STOCK UP ON ESSENTIALS: Ensure you have enough nonperishable food and water to last at least three days. Canned goods, dry snacks, and bottled water are ideal. Don't forget a manual can opener!
- 3. WARM CLOTHING AND BEDDING: Gather extra blankets, sleeping bags, and warm clothing. #210902 Layering clothes can help retain body heat. Thermal underwear, wool socks, and hats are particularly useful.
- 4. HEATING ALTERNATIVES: If you have a fireplace or wood stove, ensure you have a good supply of dry firewood. Portable space heaters that run on propane or kerosene can be useful, but ensure proper ventilation to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning.
- 5. POWER SOURCES: Consider investing in a generator for backup power. Make sure you know how to operate it safely and have enough fuel stored. Solar-powered chargers for phones and other small devices can also be helpful.
- 6. **STAY INFORMED:** Keep an eye on weather forecasts and stay informed about the status of the power outage. Remember to contact the Freeborn Mower Electric Cooperative emergency line at (800)734-6421 or (507) 373-6421 to report an outage.
- 7. PLAN FOR COMMUNICATION: Have a plan to communicate with family and friends. Text messages often go through when calls do not. Keep a list of emergency contacts handy.

Our crews are committed to restoring power as safely and quickly as possible in the event of an outage. We strongly encourage our members to have a plan in place should an outage occur.



WINTER ELECTRIC SAFETY TIP

Heavy accumulations of ice and snow coupled with fluctuating winter temperatures can bring down utility poles, trees, and limbs.

In a winter storm emergency, restoring power and heat to our members is the highest priority, and electric utility crews work around the clock to restore service. Even so, it can take days to repair the devastating damage of a winter storm.

If you are in the midst of storm recovery, keep these safety tips in mind:

- Avoid going outside if possible. Downed power lines could be submerged in snow and ice and difficult to identify.
- When outside, treat all downed and hanging lines as if they are energized electric lines.
- Stay away, warn others to stay away, and immediately contact Freeborn Mower Electric Cooperative at (800) 734-6421 or (507) 373-6421.
- Remember that downed power lines do NOT have to be arcing, sparking or moving to be live and deadly.

ALMOND BARK PUFFCORN Submitted By: Kelsey Enger

- 7 oz. butter flavor puffcorn
- 16 oz. almond bark, cut into pieces
- sprinkles

Directions:

Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Place puffcorn in a large bowl. Melt almond bark in a separate bowl in the microwave for 30 second intervals until smooth. Pour the almond bark over the puffcorn and mix. Add sprinkles before the bark hardens.
